Message from the Executive Director

2010 found Hawthorn Hill ever diligent in our mission to help homeless families with children as the number of homeless families continues to grow.

This was also our first full year of involvement in the Rapid Re-housing collaboration. Rapid Re-housing is a new program funded through HUD. The program promotes rapidly re-housing homeless families and individuals. Participants in the program are provided a housing subsidy for up to 18 months. They are also provided supportive services to help them attain self-sufficiency.

Hawthorn Hill has been collaborating with 5 other organizations to implement the program. The collaborating agencies are: Anawim Housing, HOME, Inc., House of Mercy, Interfaith Hospitality Network, and Primary Health Care. Hawthorn Hill's involvement in the program includes providing supportive services/case management for families in the program. We provided supportive services to 18 families during 2010.

We also are working with Holy Trinity Parish to provide short term transitional housing for homeless families with children. Holy Trinity Parish provides a housing unit including utilities for a homeless family selected by Hawthorn Hill. The families selected transition from

New Directions Shelter. We provide the supportive services to help the families become economically self-sufficient and move into their own apartment. Last year, we served 2 families.

Our New Directions Shelter program served 105 families during 2010 and The Home Connection served 27 families. All together, in our two programs, we served 132 families including 325 children. These families would not have been provided the help they needed to get back on their feet without your support for Hawthorn Hill.

However, even though we provided housing and supportive services for 132 families, we still did not meet our community's need for services for homeless families. During 2010, we turned away almost 1,600 individuals from New Directions Shelter because we were already at capacity. This reflects an increase of almost 250% over turn aways in 2009.

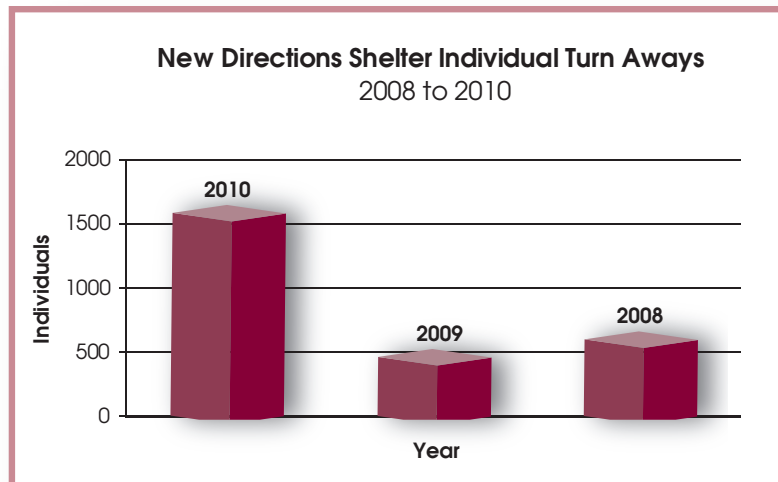

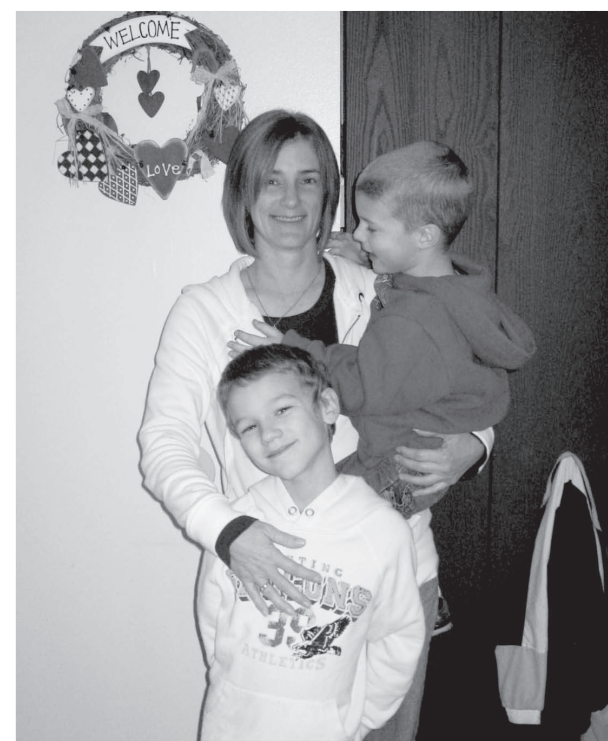

The Home Connection Program – “A Life Changer”

Karla came to Hawthorn Hill’s The Home Connection program in 2008. She had left House of Mercy where she had spent several years recovering from an addiction to meth but she still needed to work on achieving economic self-sufficiency and stability. Karla believed that The Home Connection program would provide the case management help she needed to become financially stable and to continue her recovery from addiction.

Once Karla entered The Home Connection program, she immediately started working with our case management staff to become financially independent. It was very important to her to provide a bright future for her two children. It was her big dream to some day become a homeowner and provide the stable life her children deserved.

During Karla’s tenure in the Home Connection program, she significantly improved her credit score and finished paying off all her debt. She also worked hard on continuing her education. She had started working on an Associates Degree while at House of Mercy and continued working on the degree when she came to The Home Connection program. She not only obtained her Associates Degree in Human Services from Des Moines Area Community College, but she also received a Bachelor’s Degree from Grand View University. Additionally, Karla had an opportunity to become a Parent Support Specialist, a full time position for a local nonprofit.

Due to Karla’s hard work and overcoming many obstacles, she became a homeowner through Habitat for Humanity in October 2010, approximately 2 ½ years after entering The Home Connection program. Karla is just one of many Hawthorn Hill success stories of 2010.

Program Success

New Directions Shelter

- Provides free, temporary, emergency shelter and services for homeless mothers and their children.
- Helps mothers get a new start through professional case management, counseling and advocacy.
- Provides eight private bedrooms, balanced meals and laundry facilities.

The Home Connection

- Provides transitional housing and supportive services to homeless families with emphasis on attaining financial independence and home ownership.
- Case management staff works with families to identify the causes of their homelessness and develop a plan, with goals, to remedy causes and attain financial independence within approximately two years.
- Is the only program for homeless families with children with single family homes and duplexes located in Des Moines neighborhoods. Program owns 21 housing units that typically serve 28 - 30 families per year.

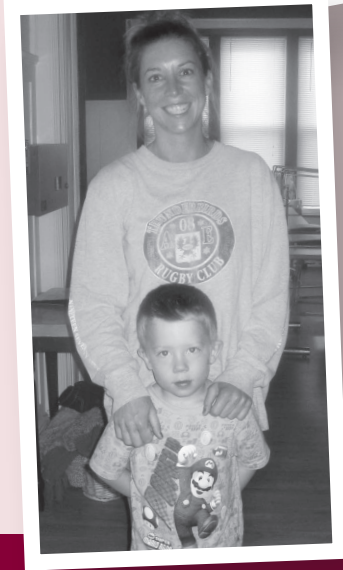
